An Educational Tour to River Island Majuli was organized by Department of Economics, B. P. Chaliha College from 24th October, 2019 to 26th October, 2019. Students of degree courses were guided by four faculty members of the department. Majuli is the biggest river island in the world which is located on the river Brahmaputra flowing in the state of Assam. It has been known as the cultural capital of Assam since the 16th century. It is one of the primary hubs of neo-Vaishnavite culture and is famous for mask making and tradition of pottery making.



The students in supervision of the teachers visited the places of Vaishnavas Satras (Kamalbari Satra, Garamur Satra, Samaguri Satra, Dakshinpat Satra and Auniati Satra) and places of Mask making and Pottery Making. Satras are the hub of traditional art and folk culture. Students experienced and felt the rich cultural legacy of the state. They personally met the “Satradhikar” (religious head) of Auniati Satra and participated in the regular practice of “Prashangas” (prayers) and experienced the “Ozah-Pali” (dances that are performed regularly in Satras).
